

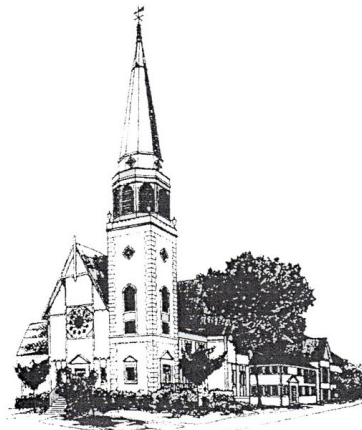


The Rev. Adam Blakeman was born in Gnosall, Staffordshire, England on June 10, 1598. In May 28, 1617, he went to Christ Church College at the University of Oxford, England. He was a preacher for some years in Great Bowden, Leicestershire and Derbyshire. In 1638, he voyaged across the Atlantic Ocean to Connecticut.

In 1639, he led the original settlers of Stratford, Connecticut and served as the first minister of the church until his death on the 7th day of September in the year 1665.

Like a number of other New England towns during that time; Stratford was founded as a Utopian community by the Puritans fleeing religious persecution in England. The town's minister was also its political leader and ruled both his flock and his town as the unquestioned representative of God.

The first church or meetinghouse was erected at Mac's Harbor where the first settler's along with Rev. Adam Blakeman landed in 1639.

On Nov. 18, 1678, the freedmen of the town voted to build a new meetinghouse. The *third* meetinghouse was built in 1743 and burned in 1785 after it was struck by lightning. The fourth meetinghouse was completed just 25 weeks after its construction began on Main Street. On Sunday Nov. 12, 1786, in the forenoon, the congregation met in it for public worship. This fourth meetinghouse stood for seventy-five years.

The present church is the fifth building of the Congregational Church of Stratford. The movement for its construction began at a meeting of the First Ecclesiastical Society on June 20, 1857. The dedication services of the new church were held on Oct. 27, 1859 and were attended by more than 900 people.

The architect of this current church was Leopold Eidlitz of New York. The First Congregational Church of Stratford is a fine example of the Gothic Style.
