## *“Lent, A Journey Toward Easter”*

We often speak in UCC about being on a journey. It's a dominating metaphor for Congregationalists who were once described as Pilgrims. We are people on a journey. In fact our earliest covenants defined our commitment to our faith in words such as "binding our lives to *walk together*." And why shouldn't it? The idea of a journey is something we find from the Old to the New Testament. The people of Israel were delivered from Egypt and started a forty year journey with God to the promised-land. Jesus called his disciples to follow him; in other words, to join him on this journey.

On February 22<sup>nd</sup> we begin a different kind of journey. It's a journey that lasts forty days and takes us from Ash Wednesday, to that moment when the sun rises on Easter morning. It's not just a time of introspection. It's not just a time of preparation. It's a time of journeying. It's how we get to Easter.

Getting to Easter is not simply waiting the days out to Easter day. It's getting to Easter in our hearts. I once heard a preaching professor tell a story about a Native American who traveled to his brother's funeral by way of canoe. A journey that could have taken hours ended up taking days. You see, he wasn't just interested in arriving at his destination. It was returning by the way of his ancestors, reflecting on his brother's death, and the flow of life, that helped him to arrive for this funeral service prepared in much deeper ways. That's what I mean by journeying toward Easter. If we don't begin by hearing Christ speaking to us as we begin Lent, these words. "If you want to be my disciple, then you must deny yourself, take up your cross and follow me." If we don't share with Jesus and his disciples his last meal, if we don't spend the evening with him as he prayed in the garden, or watch from a distance his trial, the reaction of his disciples, his torture and crucifixion, then we don't come to Easter prepared. It would be similar to the Native American man arriving at his brother's funeral in a car. It wouldn't be the same. By skipping Lent, we may arrive at our destination, an Easter Service, but we may not arrive at Easter.

There will be many ways for you in the coming weeks, to travel those forty days to Easter. I've spoken of many different disciplines in years before. But as a community, you can join us for an Ash Wednesday Service on February 22<sup>nd</sup>, as we begin the journey, Palm Sunday Concert on April 1<sup>st</sup>, as we travel through the last week, a Maundy Thursday Service on April 4<sup>th</sup>, a Community Good Friday Service on April 6<sup>th</sup>, and a Sunrise Service around 6:00am at Booth Park on April 8<sup>th</sup>, as well as our traditional service at 10:00am. These are some ways during the forty days of Lent, that we can journey together toward Easter.

## *The War Years*

Many Readers have commented about the lists of soldiers serving during the war[s] whose names were archived in the various church publications. This is a good thing, because we need to remember. Remembering strengthens relationships, reminds us who we are, reaffirms our commitment to one another, and makes us whole.

Winnie Ingram remarked that her brother Winstan served in the wars, and was a member of this church.

Bette Richardson called and said that she and her husband Don remember many who were in the Fireside Club who also served. They remembered Don's brother, John Richardson, Doug Waterhouse, Elwood Hattersley, Ann Jones and Paul Starbucks.

The list goes on. My meager resources as librarian, born after WWII, only a member of this congregation a mere 37 years or so, leave me unknowing and ill-prepared to make an exhaustive list of those who served. One would need to consult church historians, and their records, wherever they may be found.

## Historical Moment

In the following piece of historical fiction, two female members of First Congregational are chatting on the steps of the Town House and Conference Room behind the church, about where Packard Hall sits today. They haven't seen one another for a while. It's August, 1859.

Hattie: Winnifred dear, I haven't seen you in a year of Sundays. Wherever have you been?

Winnifred: Why, Hattie, Hezekiah and I went to San Francisco for 2 years to establish his fur trading business with the Astors. My, my, I don't recognize this corner. They've moved our beloved church, where Zeke and I were married, to the South West, just beyond the Town House, here. And the new church is almost completed, I see.

Hattie: Yes, Winnifred, and you probably didn't hear: we have a new minister, *again*.

Winnifred: Whatever do you mean, *again*? We just settled on Reverend Page a scant 2 years ago just before we left for California.

Hattie: He returned to Perry, New York, with his wife and children.

Winnifred: Did he now? Wasn't that where he came from before we called him here?

Hattie: Yes indeed. In my opinion, his wife missed her kinfolk, although no reason was given for his dismissal. The church called Reverend Benjamin Swan. Perhaps you remember him?

Winnifred: Oh yes, a fine preacher, very likeable.

Hattie: Plans are set for the new church building's dedication for this Fall, on October 27. Reverend Swan, according to my husband, will speak on "Life's Memorial Days."

Winnifred: Oh, I'm sure that'll be very fitting.

Hattie: Moreover, they're expecting almost a thousand people to come to the dedication. I'm sure everyone wants to see the building, as it's the talk of the State, and the spire is the only one of its kind outside of New York City.

Winnifred: I expect so. It's quite a deviation from the traditional New England oblong meeting House design. I'm surprised we were able to raise the twenty thousand Dollars to build it.

Hattie: Yes, especially in these trying times. There's talk of secession if Mr. Lincoln gets elected a year from now, next November.

Winnifred: Let's pray fervently that the country stays together.

Hattie: Amen to that. It's almost time for service to start. See you in church!

# Game

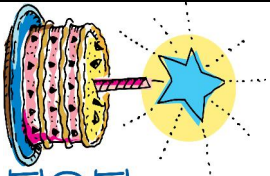
Try this twist on musical chairs.

**What you need:**

- 28 large index cards
- Black marker
- Two teams of people
- Radio or CD player

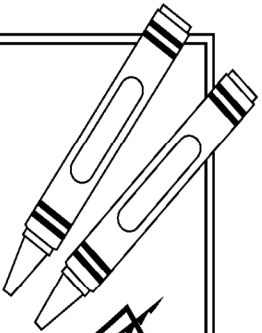
**What you do:**

1. On index cards, write out *forgiveness*, one letter per card. Make two sets (two F's, two O's, etc.).
2. Mix up the cards and form them face up in a circle on the floor. (You'll have six blanks mixed in.)
3. Have teams mix themselves up and stand in a circle around the cards. Ask an extra person to turn the music on and off.
4. As the music plays, teams walk around the circle. When the music stops, players each pick up the card nearest them.
5. Team members take their cards to a designated area and try to spell forgiveness. Any double letters or blanks go back to the "music person," who reorganizes remaining cards, spacing them evenly into a fresh circle.
6. Play continues until one team spells *forgiveness*.

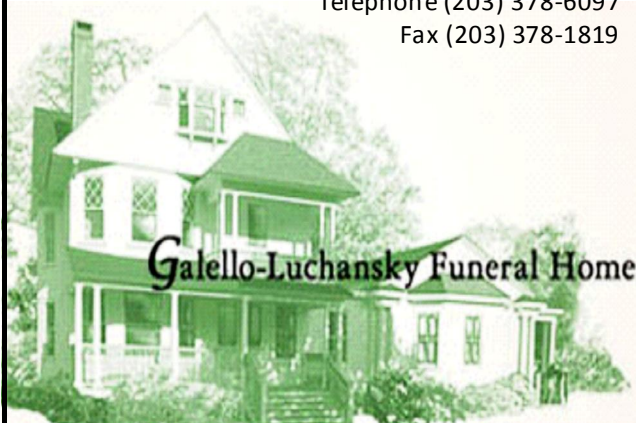
